

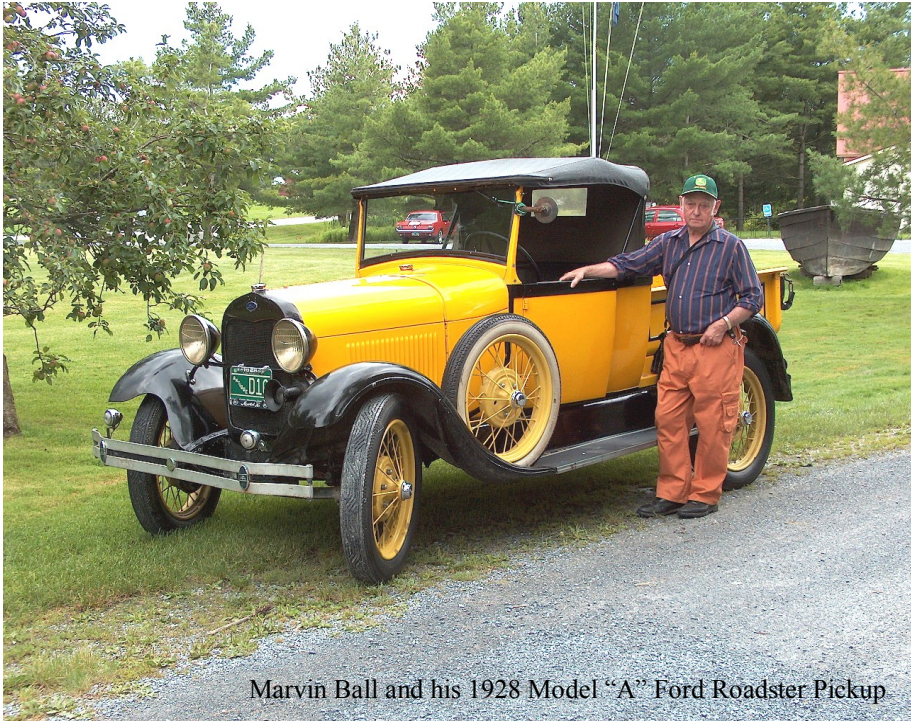

The Iconic 1928 Model "A" Ford Roadster Pickup

This Model "A" Ford Pickup started life as a cab in Chelsea, VT. It was subsequently sold and relocated to Hinesburg, VT in 1969 and many parts were added.

Later it was resold to a party in Essex Jct., VT. As the story goes it then went, in bits, pieces and parts to another person in Milton, VT

Enter *Marvin Ball*: Marvin was now in the position to start a search for and another project as he had sold his roadster and a pickup truck. The year was 1974 and after some searching, Marvin found this Model "A" Ford languishing, now in Charlotte, VT. \$600 and two pickup truck loads of parts, bits and pieces later, the Model "A" was on its way to Marvin's shop.

Once he started the project, Marvin soon discovered that half of the parts were missing or in such sad shape that they either had to be replaced or rebuilt, those that could be rebuilt, that is.

Ten years after the project started, in 1984 it was back on the road. A new top went on in 1986 and another project in 1988 led to the addition of new seats.

Marvin says, "It's not a show truck, it has some '28

and '29 bits and pieces but it's been a "go-places" truck and has been in mud, raging rain and the September cold. It's a long way to Bennington in September with the Roadster with no side curtains, but it looks good from 60 feet," quips Marvin.

(Marvin, I bet there are hundreds of folks that would just love to have the Model "A" in their garage. It's a beauty! gf)

Lunch at 12 noon. Meeting about 1:00

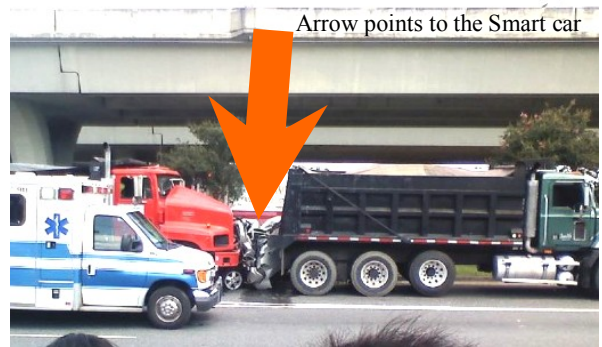

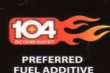

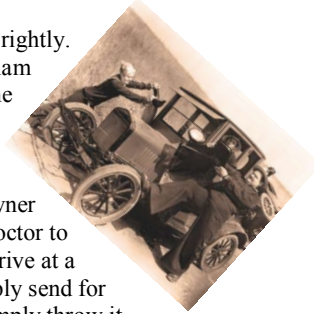

More on Ethanol - 10

Ronald Newfield (WT November page 7) made an excellent point in his note in last month's WT in regards ethanol gas and is something that I have suspected for some time, but he puts some good data behind it. He has made a systematic comparison of fuel consumption by the same vehicles with non-ethanol gas and the ethanol-10 that we most frequently find in our area today. In brief, he finds that he gets a reduction of 10.5% in mpg using ethanol-10, which is 90% gasoline and 10% ethanol. This means that if you remove 10% of the gas from each gallon and substitute ethanol for the removed gas, you travel 10.5% fewer miles on that gallon. This is slightly worse than you would get if you removed 10% of the gas and substituted nothing. Ethanol is worse than nothing! The ethanol has a deleterious effect on the remaining gas. Add this to the energy consumed planting, fertilizing, harvesting and transporting the corn; and then distilling it to collect the ethanol and the overall picture gets worse. If we bought the gas and ethanol separately, put the gas in the tank and drank ethanol, we'd be better off and a lot happier. It never made sense to waste perfectly good corn licker in the gas tank. *Wendell Noble*

This marks the 8th year that dollars- \$8000 (approximately was raised by VAE -\$7000] and now Hemmings [\$1000].

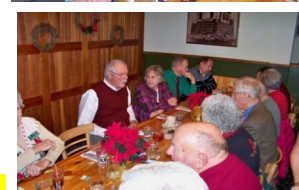
A special tour & picnic to the new camp in the islands is being tentatively planned for June, 2010. All auto hobbyists are invited.

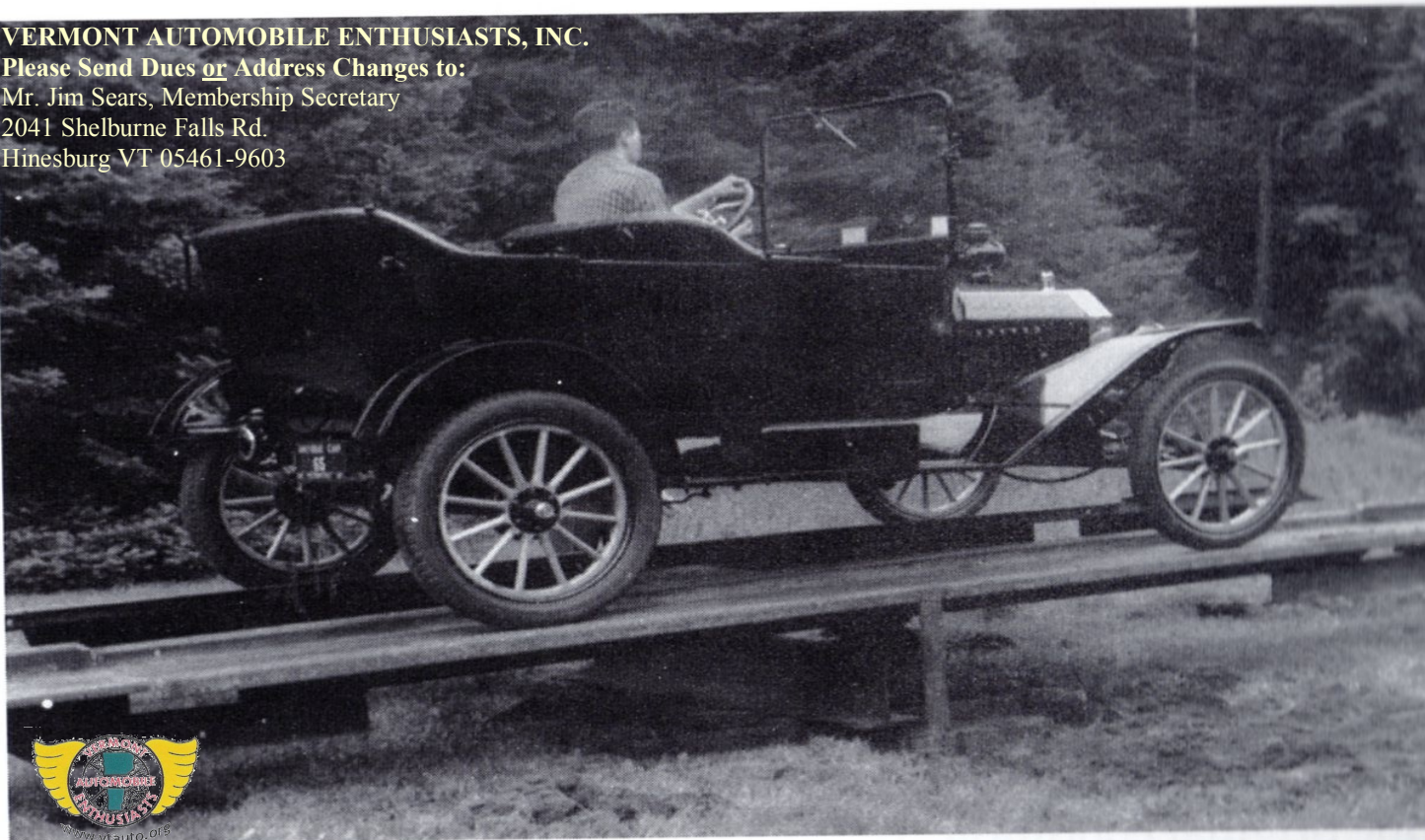
